

Browerville Swimming Pool 2023 Swimming Program

- Swimming lessons will be held again this year at the Browerville Pool. It is recommended that students have completed Kindergarten to register for the regular lessons. Children who are 5 years old, have not yet completed Kindergarten but have taken and passed the Preschool Level II class may register for the Level I class. *Preschool Level I is geared toward 3 and 4 year-olds and Preschool Level 2 is geared toward 5 year old students. A parent will not be in the water with the preschooler during Pres-school Level 1 or Pre-school Level 2. In order to enter Pre-School Level 1 a child must be able to enter the pool on their own.*
- Lesson Fees are \$50.00 per student/for children attending school at Christ the King and Browerville Public School. For all other schools the fee is \$60.00 per student.

NOTE: A class may be cancelled in the event there are not enough students enrolled. Other classes may also be changed. Parents will be notified. Every attempt will be made to fill these courses.

OPEN SWIM hours will be determined by the number of individuals in lessons. It will be posted in the future on the Browerville school website.

FEES: Season Pass-Resident Family \$150.00, Resident Single \$75.00. Resident Single session \$5.00-afternoon session and \$3.00 evening session..

Season Pass-Nonresident Family \$160.00. Nonresident Single \$80.00. Nonresident Single Session \$7.00-afternoon session and \$5.00 for evening session.

- Private Parties \$150.00 per hour and includes two lifeguards.

Swimmers are not to be near the diving board while the board is being used. This is done for safety reasons. The on-deck guards may designate one or two timed segments during open swim when the diving board will be closed to allow swimmers the opportunity to swim in the deep end; retrieve rings on the bottom and jump or dive off the NORTH end of the pool. If the pool is extremely busy, the board will remain open. For your safety, please swim in the south end of the pool when the diving board is being used. When a young child wishes to use the diving board, parents may provide standby assistance in the water at a safe distance from the end of the board. Please notify the lifeguard if you will be assisting your child. Both swimmers must exit the pool using the nearest ladder.
